AN ORDINANCE CONFIRMING THE MAYOR'S APPOINTMENT OF STEVEN J. PRESLEY TO THE POSITION OF PART-TIME FINANCE DIRECTOR, ESTABLISHING THE RATE OF COMPENSATION FOR SAID POSITION, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

## BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AVON LAKE, STATE OF OHIO:

Section No. 1: That the appointment by the Mayor of Steven J. Presley, to serve as the part-time Finance Director for the City of Avon Lake from October 12, 2022, up to and including December 31, 2022, is hereby confirmed by Council.

<u>Section No. 2:</u> That the powers, duties, and responsibilities to be performed and undertaken by the part-time Finance Director shall be those set forth for such position as prescribed by Avon Lake City Charter Section 26.

<u>Section No. 3:</u> That based on Mr. Presley's experience and ability, Council does hereby fix and establish an annualized salary of \$78,786, payable bi-weekly for the position.

Section No. 4: That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees which resulted in such formal actions, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section No. 5: That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, the emergency being the necessity of employing a part-time Finance Director until such time as a full-time Finance Director shall be appointed to ensure the efficient operation of the Finance Department, thus for the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Avon Lake. Therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and immediately after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
